#### From the Grand Sword Bearer

Although Masonry is not a religion, there is an undeniable spiritual aspect whose threshold is the Great Light in Masonry; the Holy Bible. We see the role of the Chaplin in our Lodge as a significant and necessary element in Opening and Closing Lodge as well as within each Degree. I thought we would offer a small examination of the Bible verse for the Entered Apprentice. Each degree is framed by a verse and in turn, this verse offers insight to both us and the candidate.

#### **Entered Apprentice Degree**

Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity! It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard, that went down to the skirts of his garments; as the dew of Hermon, and as the dew that descended upon the mountains of Zion: for there the Lord commanded the blessing, even life forevermore. Psalms 133

As the candidate is stopped after the initial perambulation, these words are heard. These words, which intend to calm, speak to unity and fellowship: what a pleasure it is to "dwell together in unity" or to be in the presence of a body of men united together in mind and spirit of purpose. This peaceful unity is of utmost importance to Masons as it is the mortar or cement that binds us together as a fraternity.

The next section alludes to the oil running down his beard. Aaron, the elder brother of Moses, and his sons were appointed by God to be the High Priest and ministers of God for the children of Israel. God directed that an "oil of holy ointment" was to be poured upon Aaron and his sons as a blessing prior to their entry as priests into the tabernacle, containing all the holy vessels and the Ark of the Covenant, to minister and pray unto the Lord. This reference therefore alludes to the sacredness of such unity.

Finally, Mount Hermon was known to have copious amounts of humidity, even in the driest weather, which formed on the tents that it appeared as though it had rained the whole night. This precious dew or water provided continuous life giving growth to the plants and animals of the otherwise arid region; hence the allusion to life forevermore

The theme of the Entered Apprentice Degree then is that he is about to enter into a fraternal union with men of good character. This unity of good brethren is so precious that it is comparable to the holy anointing of the High Priest of the ancient Israelites. Further, his association with this fraternal unity promises to enrich his future life just as the dew of Mount Hermon and the mountains of Zion.

#### From the District Advisor

As members of the Masonic Fraternity, we are individually imbued with the charge to relieve the troubled and indigent, and to bring comfort to the distressed Master Mason, the widowed and orphaned. The benevolent nature of our gentle Craft was first illustrated in Brother William Preston's "Illustrations of Masonry" written in 1772, where he states emphatically that "to relieve the distressed is a duty incumbent on all men, but particularly

on Freemasons, who are linked together by an indissoluble chain of sincere affection. To soothe the unhappy, to sympathize with their misfortunes, to compassionate their miseries, and to restore their troubled minds, is the great aim we have in view."

In reading today's headlines, it should come as no surprise to predict an upsurge in the number of petitions being received from Masons and Non-Masons seeking our help, aid and assistance. As such, we should become familiar with the mechanisms in place to answer that call when it arrives.

Our District is very fortunate and has had the foresight to establish through the generosity of our members and Lodges an emergency fund whose mission is to fulfill that promise we have all made as Master Masons; to help, aid and assist distressed Masons, their Widows and Orphans. The idea for such a worthy fund was conceived after Hurricane Sandy visited New York in 2012 with its unrelenting path of flooding and destruction along our coastline.

Several of our Brethren were directly and adversely affected by this super-storm and found themselves in dire need of physical and financial assistance. Ten years since that fateful event, our District stands tall and prepared to fulfill our sacred promise, should the need ever materialize once again. Today, our Fifth Manhattan Purple Circle Relief Fund (PCRF) has accumulated over \$78,000 earmarked for such emergencies. A big thank you is owed and deserved by our Past District Deputy Grand Master, R.W. Edward M. Weigert, who spearheaded the formation of this fund and to our Fifth Manhattan Endowment Fund who has been a major contributor to the PCRF. But most importantly, to each of you my brothers for your continued support of the PCRF.

In tandem with our Fifth Manhattan District's PCRF, the Grand Lodge of New York nearly three-quarters of a century ago answered the call of the distressed. The Grand Lodge Committee on Masonic Benevolence was established in March 1949. In addition to providing help and financial assistance through the Committee, and where appropriate through the member's Lodge and District; the Committee assists the distressed in seeking further help from government agencies, community service groups, and private and other Masonic resources.

Assistance provided by the Committee can be arranged under three basic categories: (a) short-term emergency financial assistance; (b) long-term planning which may necessitate institutional care or assisted living facilities; and (c) legal or other professional advice and counseling.

While the Committee has broad flexibility, the following policies are currently in place to facilitate the granting of assistance to those in need:

- 1) Financial aid will primarily be given to Master Masons, their wives, widows, orphans and dependent minor children.
- 2) Individuals seeking assistance should first contact the Master or Secretary of the Masonic Lodge that they or their family member is or was affiliated with in order to make their situation known.

- 3) The Master upon notification should appoint an investigating committee charged with the responsibility of visiting the distressed person's home, and to help the applicant to complete the required application form. (The short form is to be used for applications seeking \$500 or less, and the long form is for applications seeking amounts greater than \$500.)
- 4) The Investigating Committee must indicate that the distressed person is found to be in genuine need and is worthy of receiving the same. The application needs to be completed in its entirety as it is crucial in assisting the Committee in making its decision.
- 5) In cases where the application for help, aid and assistance is granted, the Grand Lodge Committee on Masonic Benevolence will seek the cooperation and participation of the District and the Lodge to which the applicant or applicant's relative is a member.

If you are a Brother in need, or you know of a Mason or qualified family member that is in distress; you are encouraged to contact the Master of the appropriate Lodge and make the situation known. We frequently find that those in need of help are reluctant through their pride to ask for help, but this doesn't diminish their need for assistance. If this situation applies, please feel free to contact the New York State Chairman of the Masonic Benevolence Committee, Wor. Brother Hugh C. Dungey at telephone number (631) 716-0292 or via e-mail at hdungey@optonline.net for more information or for an application.

In closing, let me part with these words spoken by Brother Winston Churchill, "It is not enough that we do our best; sometimes we have to do what is required." My brothers, may the GAOTU continue to watch over you and your loved-ones and keep you safe.

- 2. The cost for camp is \$1,300 for two weeks. Registrations received after June 1st will be an additional \$200.00 per session.
- 3. There is a non-refundable deposit of \$250.00 for each session you register for.
- 4. Registration deadline is JUNE 1st. All fees and medical information are due on this date!
- 5. Financial aid will be available beginning January 1st so if you need or know someone who can use a little extra help please call or email us for a Scholarship Application. Deadline to apply is May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 6. We are bringing back the referral program. If you have a friend you would like to bring to camp, they will include your name on their application when they apply and you will receive a \$50.00 refund at the end of camp FOR EACH NEW friend you refer.
- 7. We will be offering 2-week sessions only. You can however sign up for boys/coed or coed/girls for 4-weeks (no pick up required in between sessions).
- 8. There is no busing provided.
